Luke 11-B "Persistence in Prayer

9,10) **Note**: verbs are continuous action in Greek:

Keep on asking • we ask for what we lack/need

Keep on seeking • we seek for what is not readily apparent or what we've lost

keep on knocking • we knock to remove obstacles, open doors

everyone who keeps on **asking** everyone who keeps on **seeking** everyone who keeps on **knocking**

* in Luke 18 Jesus says: "Men ought always to pray and not give up." WHY?

Common wrong reasons for persistence in prayer----

- because we think He doesn't KNOW what we need (to inform Him)
- because we think He has FORGOTTEN since the last time we prayed (to remind Him)
- because we think He is RELUCTANT to answer (to persuade Him)
- because we think He doesn't really CARE (to convince Him of the importance of our prayer)

In the sermon on the mount, Jesus covers all these wrong ideas of God:

- *God, your Father, KNOWS before you ask
- * He cares tenderly, even about small things
- * He is watching carefully over you

THEN, WHAT ARE THE REASONS FOR PERSISTENCE?

- TIMING when you're God & you're perfect: timing is everything
- CLARITY so we come to see what is REALLY important...often that changes over time
- HABIT to create the habit of seeing Him as our provider
- DEPENDENCE this is always His design for His people...keeps us close to Him
- PERSEVERANCE is developed by persevering: James: "...must finish its work..."
- BLESSING He loves it...it blesses Him to hear from you

-----PROMISE: PSALM 84:11------

"No good thing will He withhold from those who walk uprightly before Him."

★ This means that if we persist in praying in faith and He still does not say "yes"---

- ---what we are asking for is NOT a good thing (by His definition)
- ---or it is not a good thing YET (His timing is perfect)
